

# Home visit for chamber chief

CORK'S Junior Chamber of Commerce International (JCI) world president will pay a brief official visit to his home county at the end of this month.

Cobh businessman Kevin Cullinane will be in Cork from August 29 to September 2 when he will carry out a number of official engagements. Mr Cullinane was elected JCI world president at the 59th JCI World Congress last November. He is JCI's 60th president and presides over its diamond anniversary year.

By the end of 2005, he will have visited more than 50 countries around the globe.
